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Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back, we hope you have had a restful half term. The children have settled well and have made a good start to the new term.

This half term we will be studying:

Topic: 'UK City Study' / Royal Marines Heritage Trail

As part of our History Week (25/6/18 – 29/6/18), the pupils will be exploring the Royal Marines Heritage Trail. We will be walking the trail, accompanied by Bill Butler, on the morning of Monday 25th June. We will be learning about the Royal Marines in Deal during this week.

English

In Terms 6, we will be looking at autobiographies, chronological reports and information texts. We will be learning about verbs; adjectives; adverbs; apostrophes in possessives and plurals; prepositions and use of clauses with a wider range of connectives. We will also be focusing on the need to use a range of punctuation (including: commas, exclamation marks, brackets, apostrophes and ellipses); paragraphs and complex and descriptive sentences in their writing. Please continue to encourage your child with their writing and to read at home for at least 15 minutes daily as part of their homework; questioning them to check that they have understood what they have read.

Mathematics

We will continue to look at the full range of Mathematical concepts including: statistics to solve problems; interpreting bar charts, graphs and tables; Geometry: Properties of Shape and Position and Direction. Please support your child with his/her calculation skills and continue to encourage your child to learn the key addition facts, times tables facts and with learning to tell the time. Please continue to encourage your child to practise their maths at home using the Times Tables Rock Stars programme (the link can be found on the school website).

Times Tables

Children should continue to practise their x6, x7, x8, x11 and x12 tables. By the end of the Year children in Year 4 should be able to recall multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables up to 12 x 12 quickly.

RE

This term we will be discussing what it means to be on 'the journey of life' and how different religions address this deep subject!

Science

As part of our topic on 'Living things and their habitats', pupils will be learning how to:

- Recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways
- Explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment
- Recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things

Computer Science

This term our topic is 'We are meteorologists'. In this unit, the children will be learning how to understand different measurement techniques for weather, record some weather data, use spreadsheets to create charts, analyse data, explore inconsistencies in data, make predictions and present their data.

Spelling

This term we will continue to learn to spell the words on the Year 3 and 4 wordlist from the New framework.
