#### Easter Welly Decorating Competition

## **DEAL PAROCHIAL WINS COUNTY TENNIS AWARD FOR EDUCATION FOR 2017**

On Saturday 10th March 2018, Mrs Hodgson, Mr Earl and Mrs Heyworth attended the 2017 Annual Awards for Kent Tennis on behalf of Deal Parochial School.

Our school was one of three primary schools that had been shortlisted within the county for the Education Award. We were thrilled when we were announced as the winners for our category. It was particularly nice to receive our Award from Vanessa Webb (who we know so well as the tennis co-ordinator at the Deal Indoor Tennis Centre) who has recently become the president of the Kent LTA.

Earlier during the presentation evening, we had already been delighted when Daniel Hodgson, a former pupil from Deal Parochial who helps each week at our after school tennis club, won the Young Volunteer Award for 2017.

Both our School and Daniel will now represent Kent at the Regional LTA's Tennis Awards later this year.

This is a huge achievement for a small school such as ours. It reflects the hard work and dedication from Mrs Hodgson and other supporting parents. It also demonstrates how popular and successful tennis has become as an established sports option at this school. I am absolutely delighted and so proud of the honour this has brought our pupils and staff.

**Important information about a local event and Road Closures that will impact on collecting pupils at the end of a school day.**

You will already be aware from my previous newsletters that the Deal Primary and Secondary Schools have been working collaboratively towards a very important historic celebration that will be taking place in Deal. The date is swiftly advancing. Here is some up to date information about the organisation for the day.

**The Royal Marines Heritage Trail - Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> April at 3:00pm at Deal Castle.**

The official launch of the Royal Marines Heritage Trail (Deal and Walmer) will take place on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> April at 3:00pm at Deal Castle.

The Band of Her Majesty Royal Marines and a Colour Guard from HM Royal Marine Commandos will parade through the town as they "Exercise the Freedom of the Borough of Deal" with Fixed Bayonets and Colours Flying.

**It is important to note that two periods of 20 minute Road Closures in this area of Deal & Walmer will be put into place to facilitate these Parades including:-**

1. Dover Road, Walmer from Cornwall Road junction along The Strand to Gilford Road at Deal Castle and all minor roads along this route from 2:50pm to 3:20pm approximately.
2. Following the Official Launch Event at Deal Castle the Royal Marines will "Exercise the Freedom of the Borough" of Deal on the area to the East of Deal Castle and a second period of road closures will be enforced from Deal Castle to The Royal Hotel including King Street, the High Street and St George's Road between 3:55pm and 4:25pm approximately.

**It is important to note that the main Dover Road leading into and out of Deal and a number of other roads in the town will be officially closed during the period of these two Parades from about 2:55pm until 3:25pm and again between 3:55pm and 4:25pm.**

**We are aware that this will coincide with the normal end of the school day and could impact on your school run.**

We wish you to be aware of these plans in advance so that you can make alternative arrangements to collect your school pupils.

I am sure that many parents would like to take the afternoon off work and attend this very important and prestigious event.

Our current Year 5 pupils have all contributed towards a display depicting the history of Deal during the Royal Marines time in the town. The display will be on show in Deal Castle and along the front just for this day.

We would like to take all of Year 5 to stand with staff and enjoy this event. A special allocated space reserved for school parties has been arranged. Other pupils will need to be accompanied by their parents. A letter to Year 5 pupils will follow.

**Therefore, we propose that parents can opt to collect pupils at 2pm on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> April**, in order to safely depart and get to Deal Castle and the sea front area to enjoy the event and look at the children's displays that they have prepared. We will send a consent form for parents to indicate their wish to take children out of school early. Staff will remain on site for those parents who will not be attending and who will be collecting their children, by foot at the usual time of 3:15pm.
