Aim:

To encourage children to choose to read.

We have heavily invested in support programs to help children who find reading hard.

- Reading Recovery
- Building Reading Stamina,
- Dyslexia training,

but a further focus is on children who CAN read, but Choose not to.

Scholastic Reading Pro takes more account of children's reading interests for book suggestions but that is not enough.

In addition we aim to develop..

- Teacher's/all staff's knowledge of books which will inspire and switch on readers.
- Encourage the sharing of staff's* knowledge/passion for books
- Develop a rich repertoire of children's literature knowledge, being aware of award winning authors and books.
- Develop the library, with a newly appointed librarian to share more information for children on the diverse repertoire of books we hold
- Developing teacher's knowledge of their children as readers, by discussing and understanding their reading identity
- Social reading as a regular occurrence in classes; ongoing discussions/conversations around children's reading, recommendations
- Having attractive, inviting, cohort relevant book corners in every class
- Aim to develop a reading hut in the school grounds that children can
 design and make their own where book clubs can meet or for children to
 choose to read in break times.
